There is already a chicane of sorts, as shown in the 1st pic below beside the 20mph repeater. The problem is that traffic flows are low so vehicles rarely have to give way.

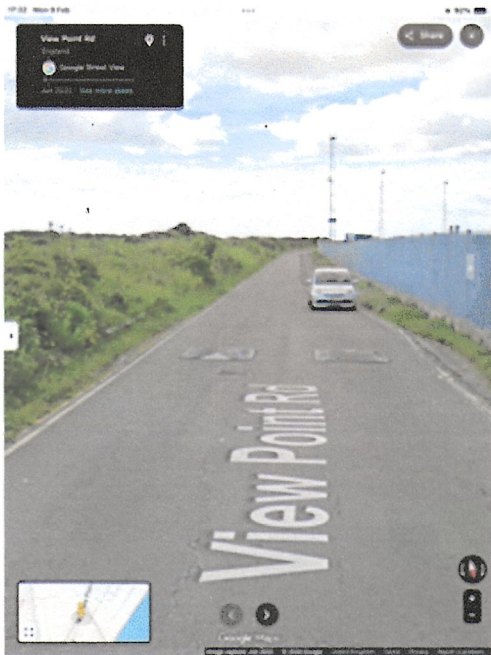
One solution may be to use "Speed Cushions", these examples are in Point View Road, Felixstowe on the road to barracks. The advance of this solution is that vehicles can put a wheel either side of the cushion, avoiding the bump, but quicker speed risk a larger bang and possible damage! This is preferred by buses, who hate full width speed bumps or sleeping policemen and School Road is a bus route.
